The Summer I Turned President Stephanie Warchol, President

On July 1, 2025, I officially assumed

the PDTA presidency. Not many realize that the PDTA presidency is a 12-month position, and I am grateful that I had the opportunity during a quieter period to get acclimated to the role. Having release time in the spring allowed for a very smooth transition both in the PDTA office with Tracy and with members of the Central Office Team. My standing meetings with HR and the Superintendent continued, and I was able to be part of the ongoing conversations on hiring, the Workplace Violence Act annual review and building tours, Capital Improvement project updates, and helping to shape what the Bell-to-Bell legislation could look like in action. I had initial meetings with department members from Athletics, Special Education, Technology, Curriculum

and Instruction, and Student Services. I also met the new Board of Education President, Jeff Casey, over coffee one morning.

To kick off the summer, I was asked to help lead the Summer Leadership Retreat which was attended by over 50 District and PDTA leaders. Superintendent Pero mentioned on opening day that the focus of the retreat was "change," which we explored through the book Switch: How to Change Things When Change is Hard by Dan & Chip Heath. We

used the framework of the book to guide our work on the Bell-to-Bell legislation, and broke up by level to start to dig in to what it would look like both in regulation and practice. Following the retreat, the facilitators met, took the work done by the large group, and created communication documents that were then reviewed by the PDTA Representative Assembly. The documents eventually became what was communicated out to the Pittsford Community.

To me, another important aspect of the presidency is relationship building. On my first official day, I reached out to all building administrators, introduced myself, and requested a sit down/building tour. They ALL happily agreed, and I cherished our time together. They answered questions like: "What are you most proud of?," "What is the building culture and staff morale like?," "Where can PDTA support you and your goals?", and "How can PDAA and PDTA partner together?" Many of them talked through scenarios they were dealing with and we

Continuing to utilize NYSUT as a resource and hold them accountable to advocate for pro-education legislation (Fix Tier Six!) is a major component of the presidency. I met separately with the Rochester Regional Director, Heidi Miller, the Regional Political Organizer, Emily Goldsmith, and our Labor Relations Specialist, Shelly

Clements. In August I attended the annual Summer Leadership Conference held in Chautauqua, NY. In addition to networking with other union leaders, which is always a fantastic learning experience, I went to several sessions that not only applied to me in this new role, but to the entire local and how we conduct business and interact with members.

Throughout the summer I took the time to meet with several PDTA leaders, onboarded new Committee Chairs and Building Reps, and worked with various Standards Leaders in person

or via email. I sat on the interview committee for the new Director of Student Services, attended two days of training on Multi-Tiered Systems of Supports,

Important information related to professional learning for 2025-26:

Collegial Circles – proposals will be accepted through March 1st. Information regarding the Collegial Circle process and the proposal form <u>is available here</u>.

Individual Initiatives — Certificated staff who attend professional learning outside the district and beyond regular work hours are eligible to request up to 12 hours of TC credit. The <u>form is on the TC webpage</u> and can be submitted to your principal for approval.

Wanda Ward PDTA Study Grants – the fall application deadline is November 1st and the spring deadline is April 15th. Application forms are on the PDTA webpage and should be submitted to the PDTA Office. Please remember that study grants will only be awarded for activities that take place outside of workdays.

Para Academy – a full program of activities is planned for our SRPs this year. Look for the details in the Elective catalog.

Contractual Requirement — Remember that the 12 required contractual hours must be completed by May 31st. Certificated staff who have not completed their contractual hours are encouraged to sign up for activities being offered this fall. Keep in mind that activities in the Electives catalog do not count toward your contractual hours.

- · Please continue to use the wording <u>attached HERE</u> to send to your administrator if you are reassigned to a position you are not trained for and do not feel comfortable in. When you are reassigned, instead of completing a gray timesheet, you will continue using <u>the Para Reassigned to Para Compensation Form</u>. <u>Here</u> is an example on how to complete the form. Please submit forms promptly and keep a copy for yourself.
- · Thank you to the new and returning Assistant SRP Representatives. Your representatives are Susan Benson (ACE), Heather White (JRE), Rebecca Tan (MCE/PR), Debbie Ricketts (MCE/PR), Radhika Ramesh (TRE), Farida Patrawala (CRMS), LaShanda Clark-McCadney (MHS) and Kelly Nanavati (SHS). They are there to support you and to provide you with answers for any questions or concerns you may have throughout the year.

- The yearly mandated Sexual Harassment Training needs to be completed by September 30. You have until December 31, 2025, to complete all other mandatory training. You can access the training through ClassLink using the Global Compliance icon. Once you click "launch" for 2025-2026 Yearly Compliance Courses All Employees, select the training, and on the next screen, you need to click "Add to My Courses" and confirm it to receive credit for the training this year. Welcome to the new school year! My name is Jen Villareale, and this is my 23rd year teaching here at PCSD. It's an honor to continue serving the PDTA membership in

my new role as Resolution Specialist. I remain committed to advocating for our collective rights and ensuring that every member is supported and informed.

Start the School Year Right: Make Sure Your Schedule Matches the Contract

The beginning of the school year is the perfect time to make sure your teaching schedule and responsibilities are aligned with your contractual rights. If you notice anything that seems off, reach out to your Building Rep for support.

Here are a few key points to review:

Understanding Overage vs. Overload

Overage - A situation in which a teacher's class/ minute load exceeds contractual maximums. When the total sections/ minutes needed to be taught exceed the available personnel, a conversation begins between PDTA and the principal/HR. We then come to resolution about how to best cover the extra section/minutes. In some instances, an overage is the best solution. The principal would then offer the overage to a teacher, who can accept or decline. If accepted, a teacher would receive an extra duty stipend for such an assignment, as outlined in contract section 6-7.

Overload - A situation in which a teacher's class size, or number of IEPs in one section exceeds contractual maximums. If this occurs, a conversation begins between PDTA and the principal/HR about how to best resolve the situation. In some instances, an extra section is created; in others, a teacher receives a negotiated payment.

Information for Traveling Teachers

If you're teaching at multiple locations, know that PDTA has advocated for supports that make your travel more manageable. A few key benefits include:

- · A 30-minute window between assignments to allow for travel
- · Reimbursement for mileage
- · Reserved parking spots at your sites

Lunch and Planning Time: Know Your Rights

Every educator is entitled to a duty-free, uninterrupted lunch. In addition, certificated staff are guaranteed planning time, which varies based on role and grade level. Make sure to review the relevant sections of your contract to verify that your schedule includes the proper amount of time for both lunch and planning.

If anything in your schedule seems out of line with the contract, reach out to your Building Rep as soon as possible so the issue can be addressed.

SICK LEAVE BANK (SLB)! – New Member Open Enrollment coming up in OCTOBER!

The intent of the SLB program is to provide the means to assist employees who, because of long-term personal illness (more than 15 consecutive school days), have nearly exhausted their personal leave benefits and would be otherwise subject to a significant loss of income. Each current unit member of the PDTA who works 0.5 or more may join the Sick Leave Bank. By contributing four days of accumulated sick leave the member is eligible for up to 30 days annually from the SLB. Unit members that have not completed 2 years of service may enroll on a prorated basis. Only persons who have contributed to the Sick Leave Bank may make a request for SLB days. You will receive an email from the PDTA office with the necessary documentation prior to the open enrollment period, Oct 1st – 31st. The SLB Documents can be found on our website.




